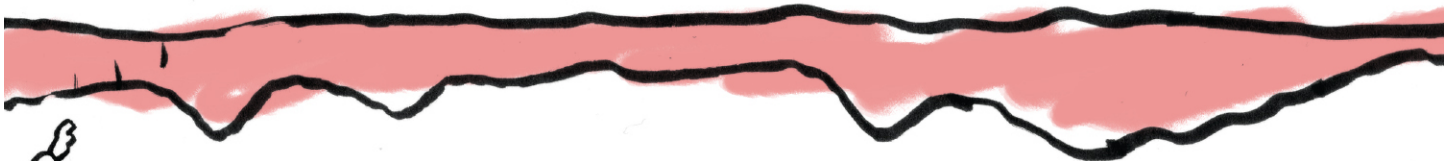
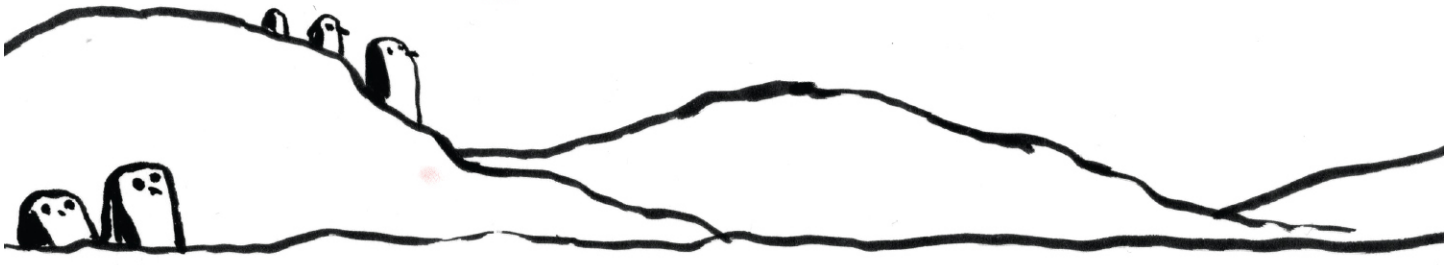
Can I have a horn, too?
